



## August Trump Country Survey

August 14-17, 2017

N=1000 Registered Voters in counties defined as "Trump Country" counties.

- N = 500 in counties that voted for Barack Obama in the 2012 presidential election but subsequently voted for Donald Trump in the 2016 election.
  - N = 500 in counties where Donald Trump's margin of victory was at least twenty points larger than the margin of victory held by Mitt Romney in the 2012 election.
  - The two samples were weighted to account for overlap between counties in those two categories.
  - Interviews were conducted via live-interview telephone (50% landline, 20% cell phone) and web panel (30%) with voter sample provided by Survey Sampling International.
  - Results were weighted to known characteristics of the target population across these counties.
