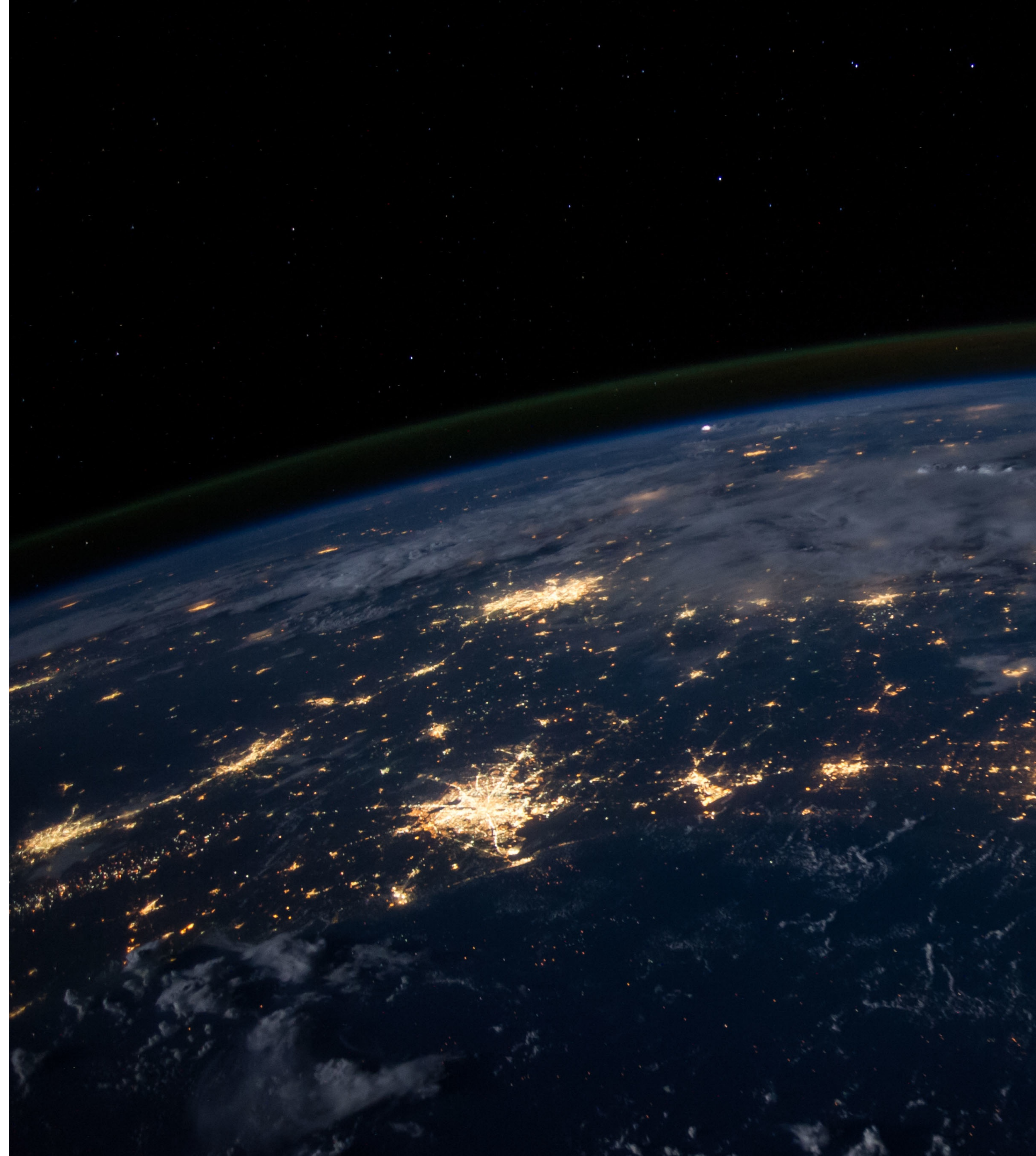

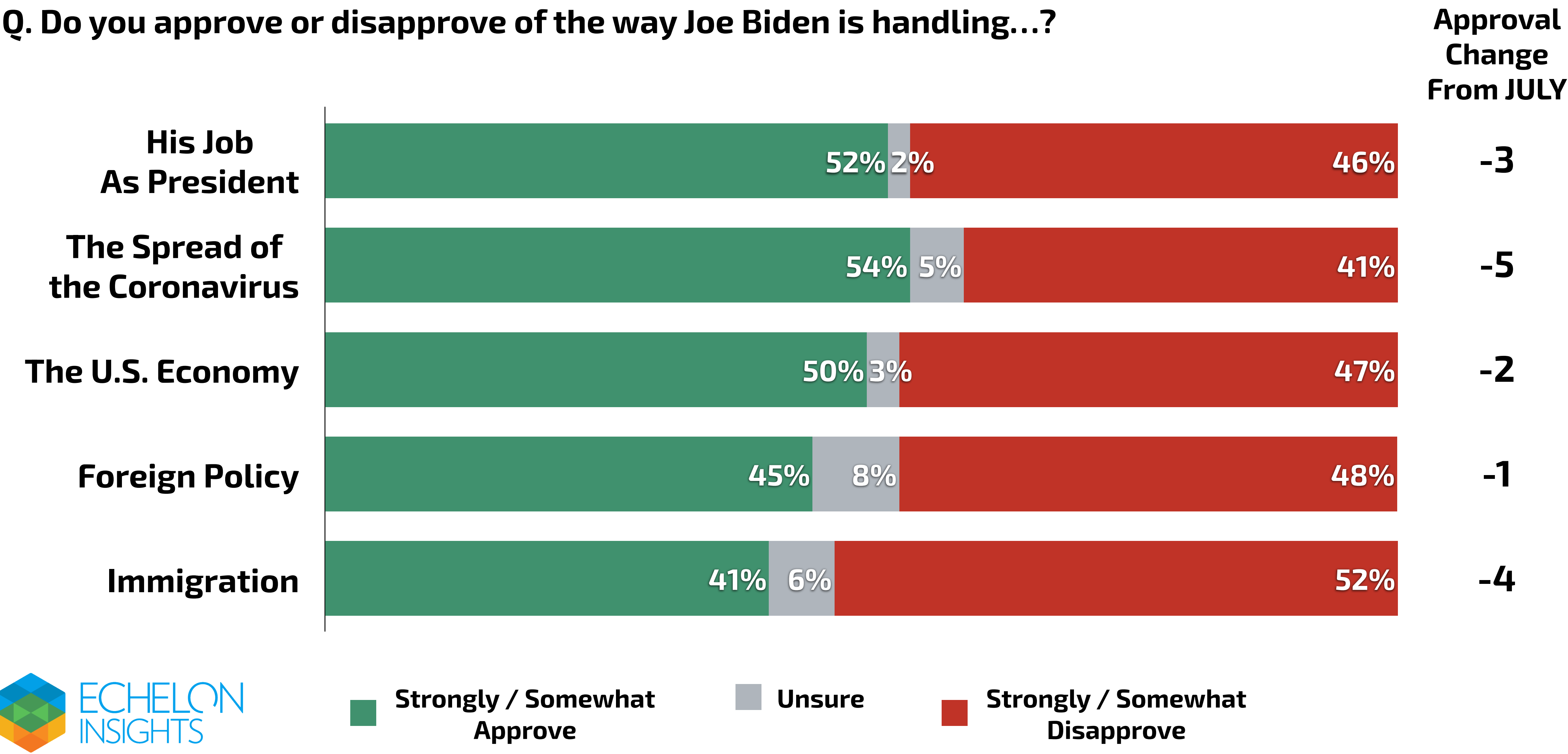

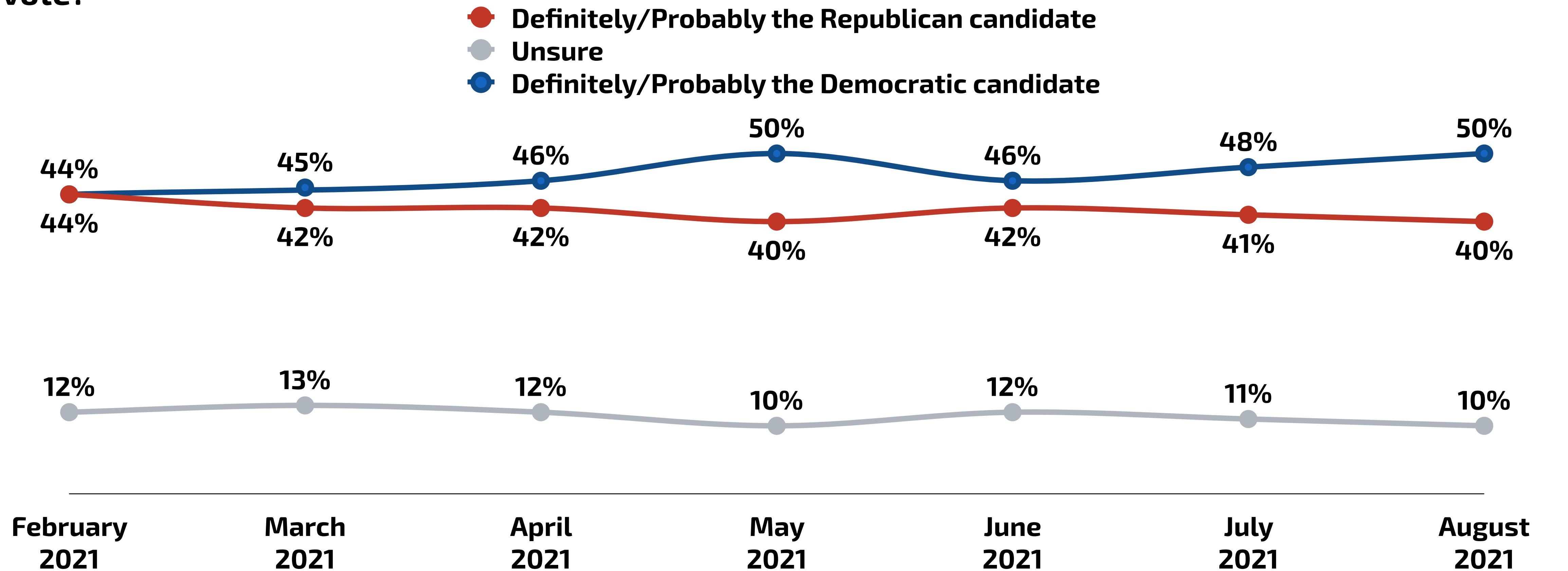


# Biden Approval Dips On All Fronts In August



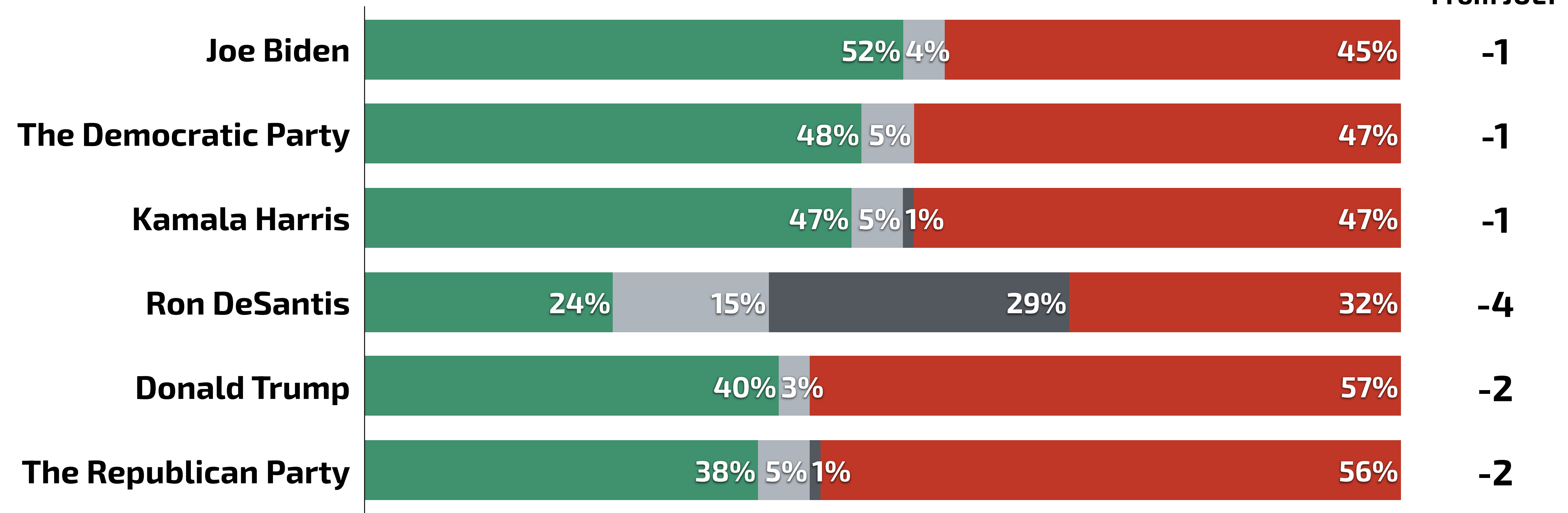
# Democrats Lead Ticks Up On August Generic Ballot

Q. If the election for Congress were held today and you had to make a choice, for whom would you vote?



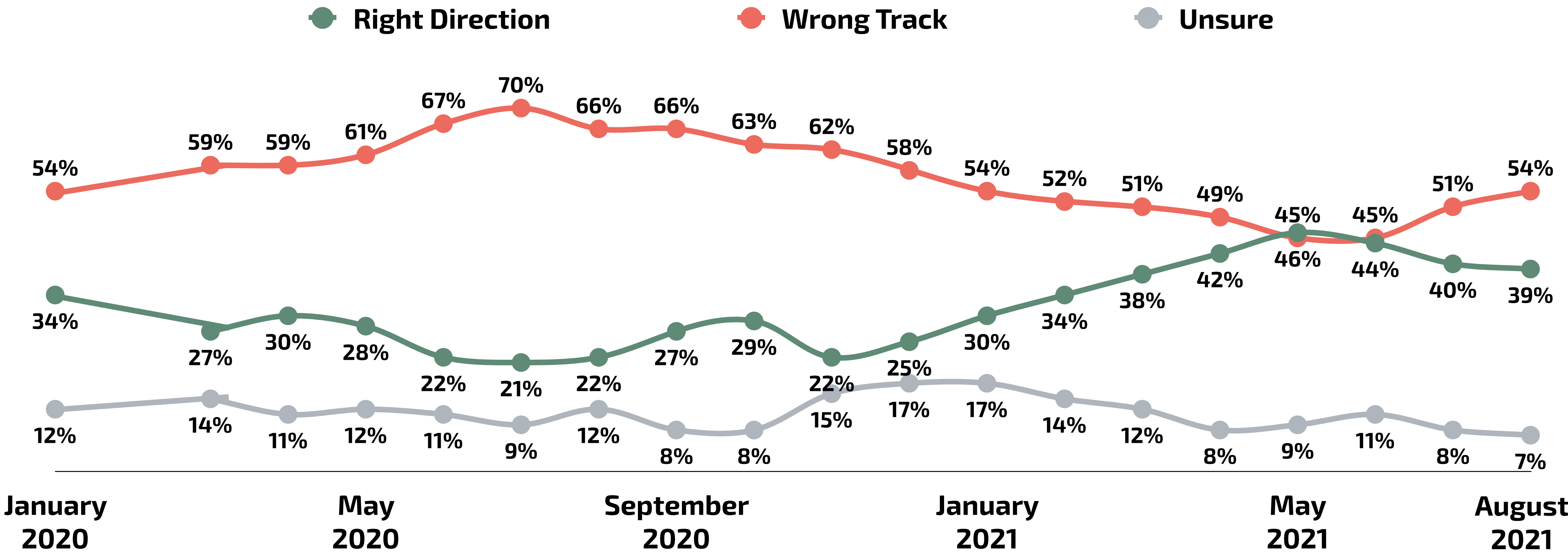
# Biden at +7 Net Fav, Harris Even

Q. Would you say things in the United States are headed in the right direction, or is the country off on the wrong track?

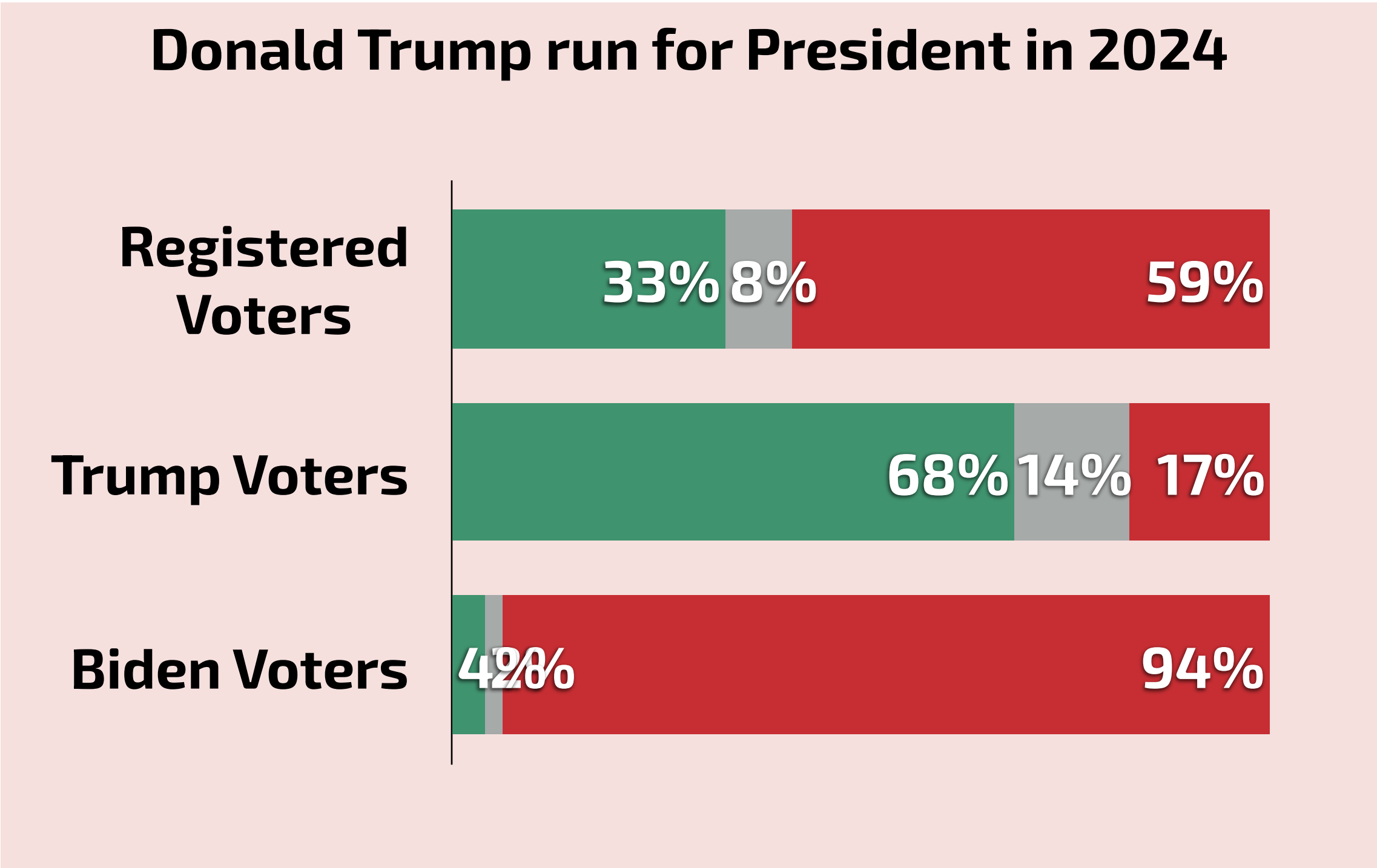
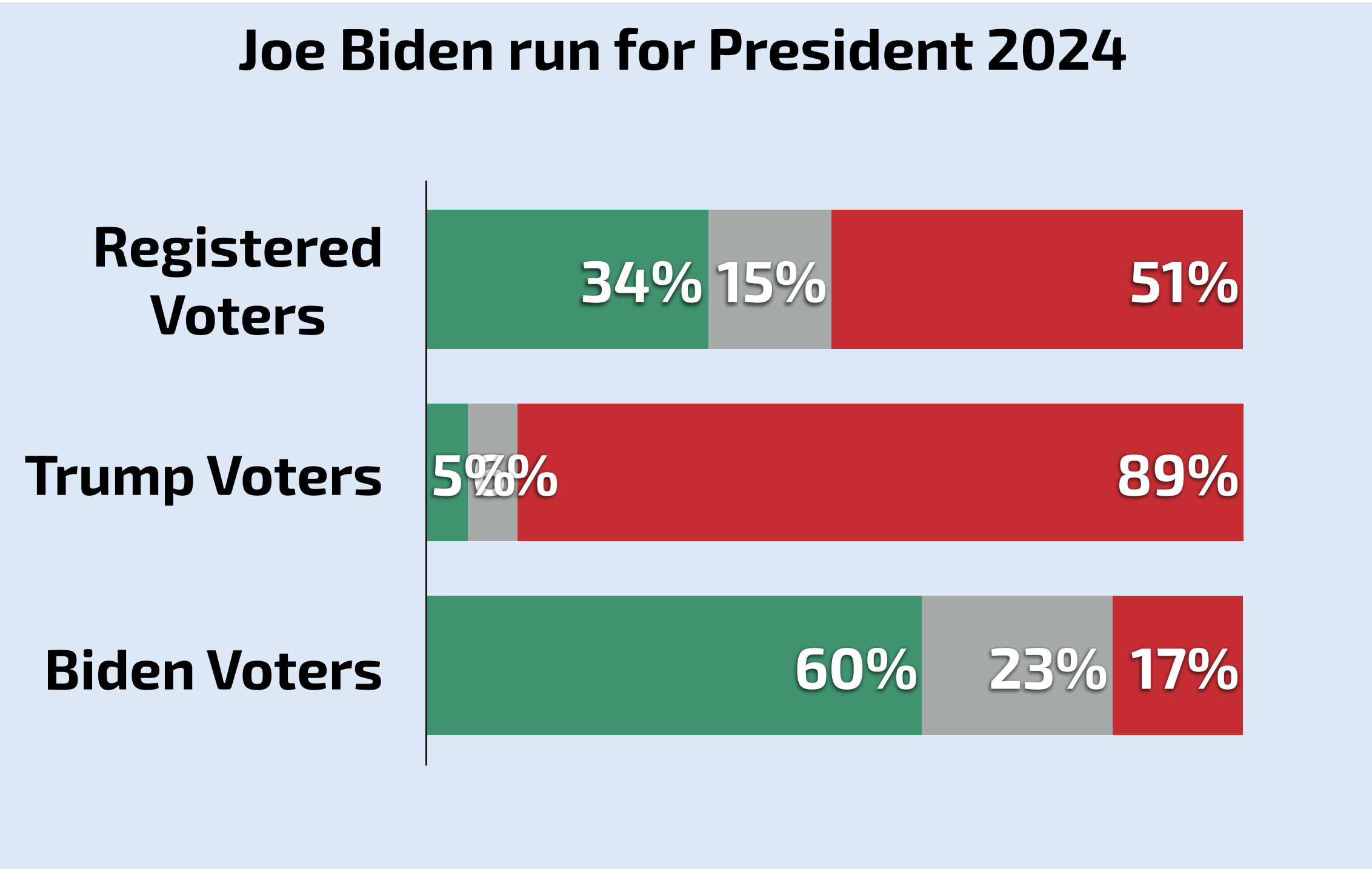

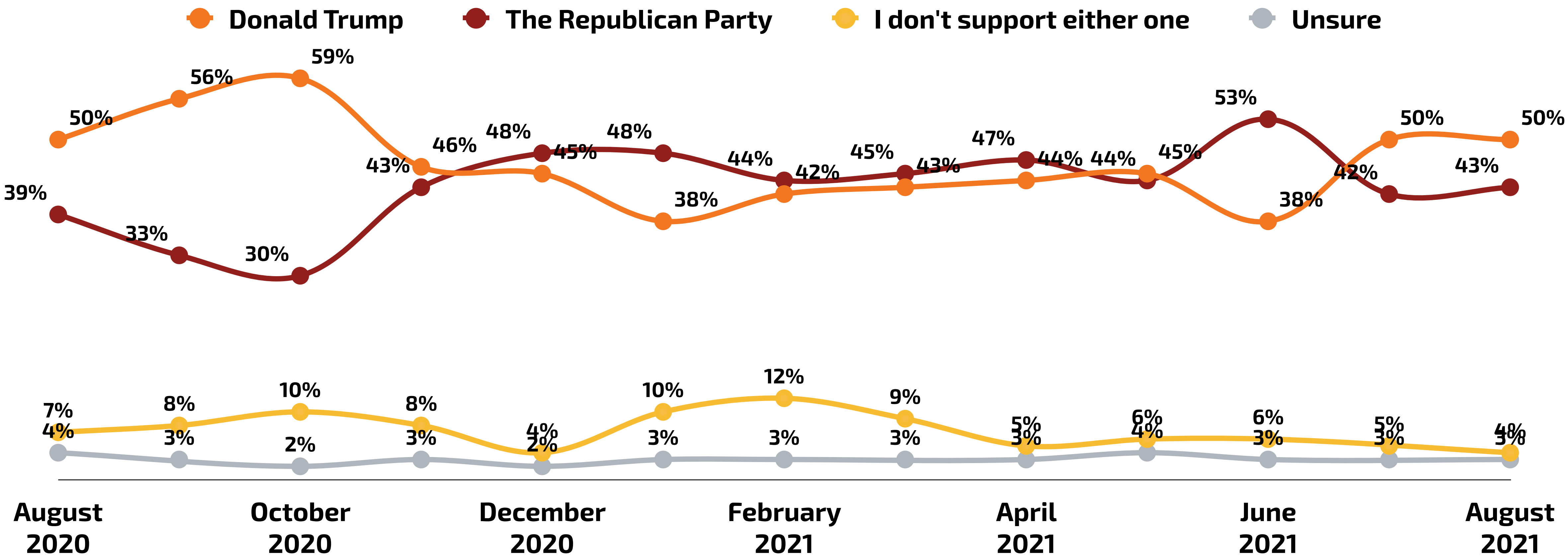

Q. Would you say you consider yourself to be primarily a supporter of Donald Trump, or a supporter of the Republican Party? [Asked of Republican+Lean Voters]

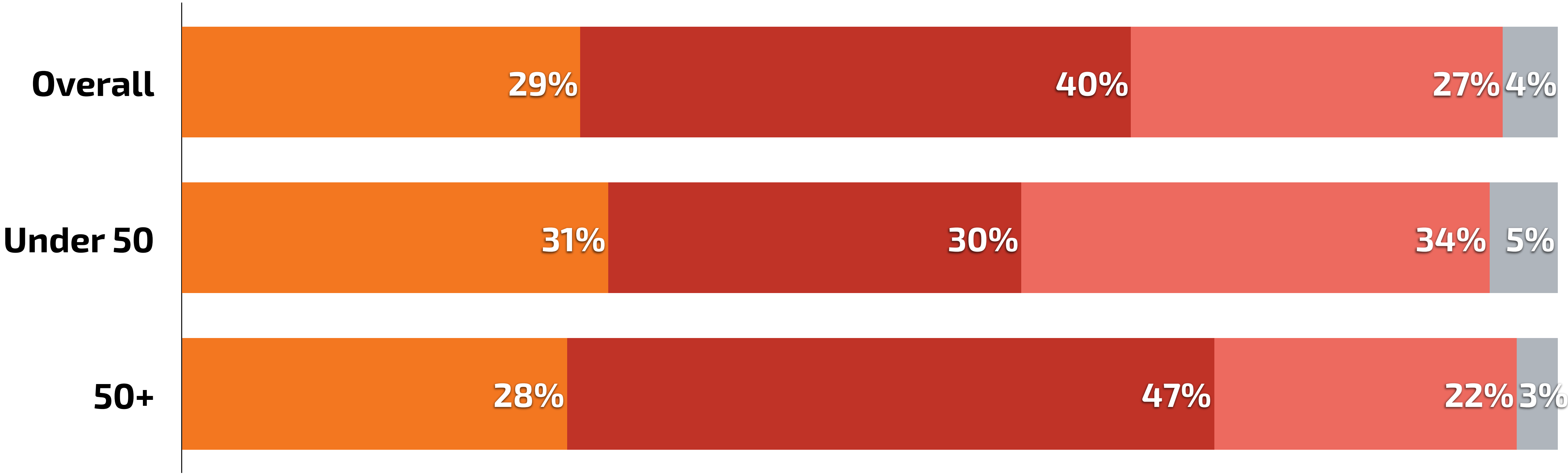




# Half Of Older Republicans Consider Themselves “Conservative Republicans”; Younger Republicans Split

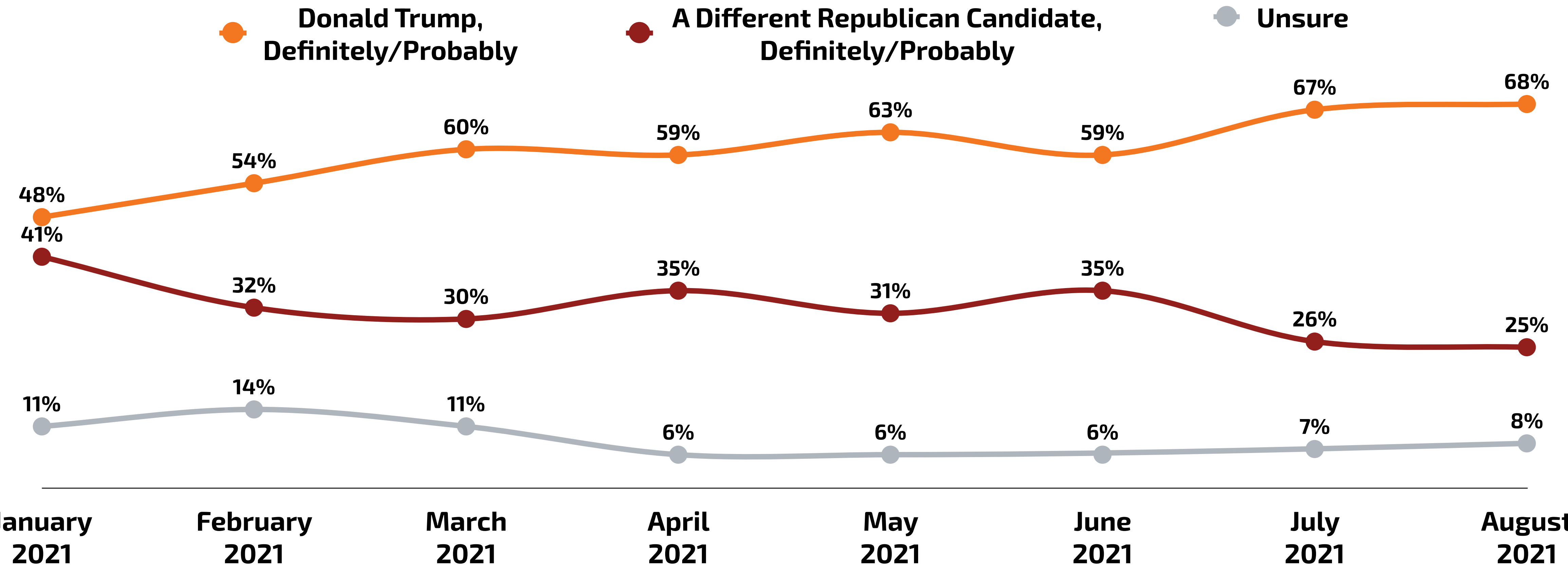

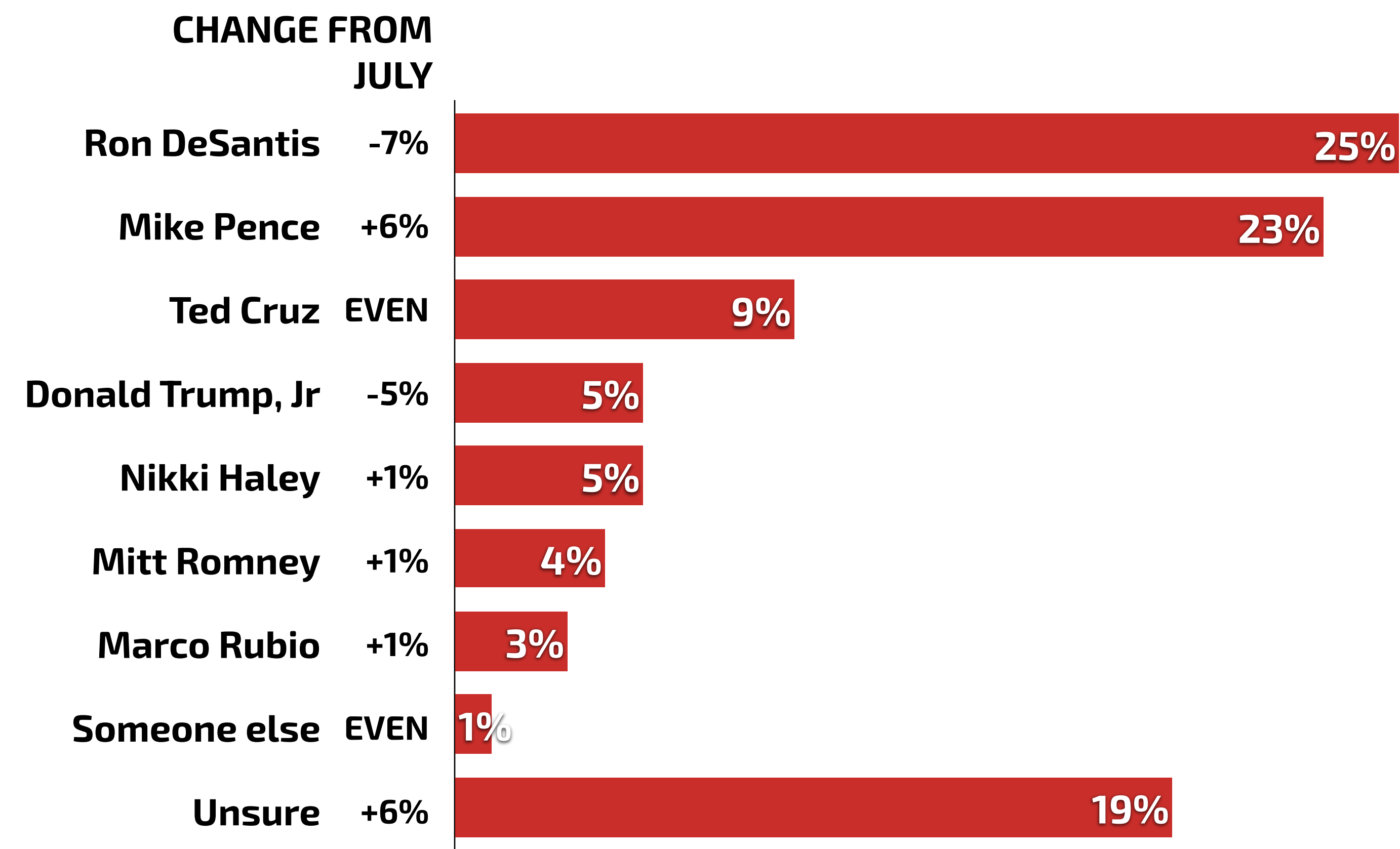
# Trump Advantage In GOP Primary Continues To Grow

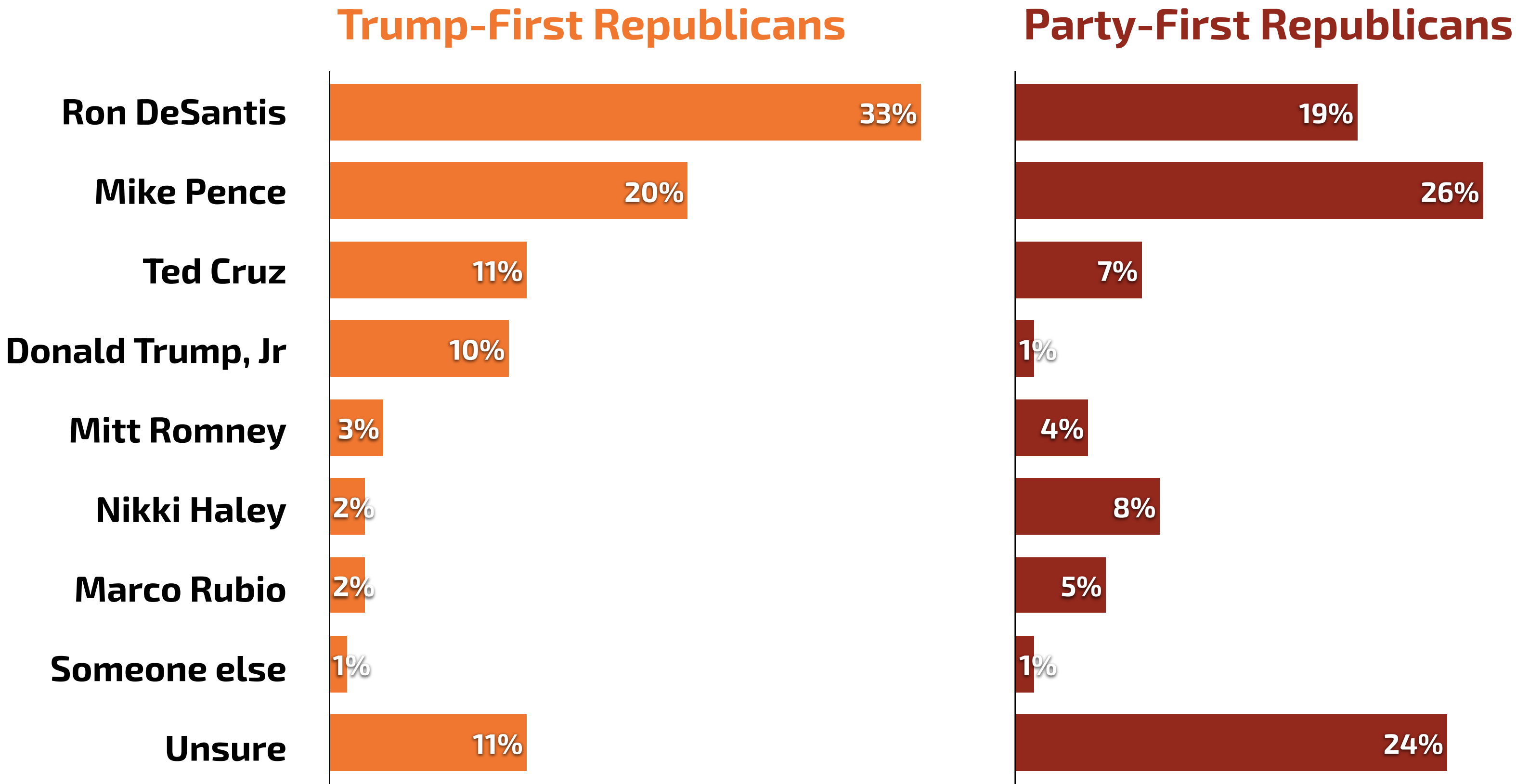

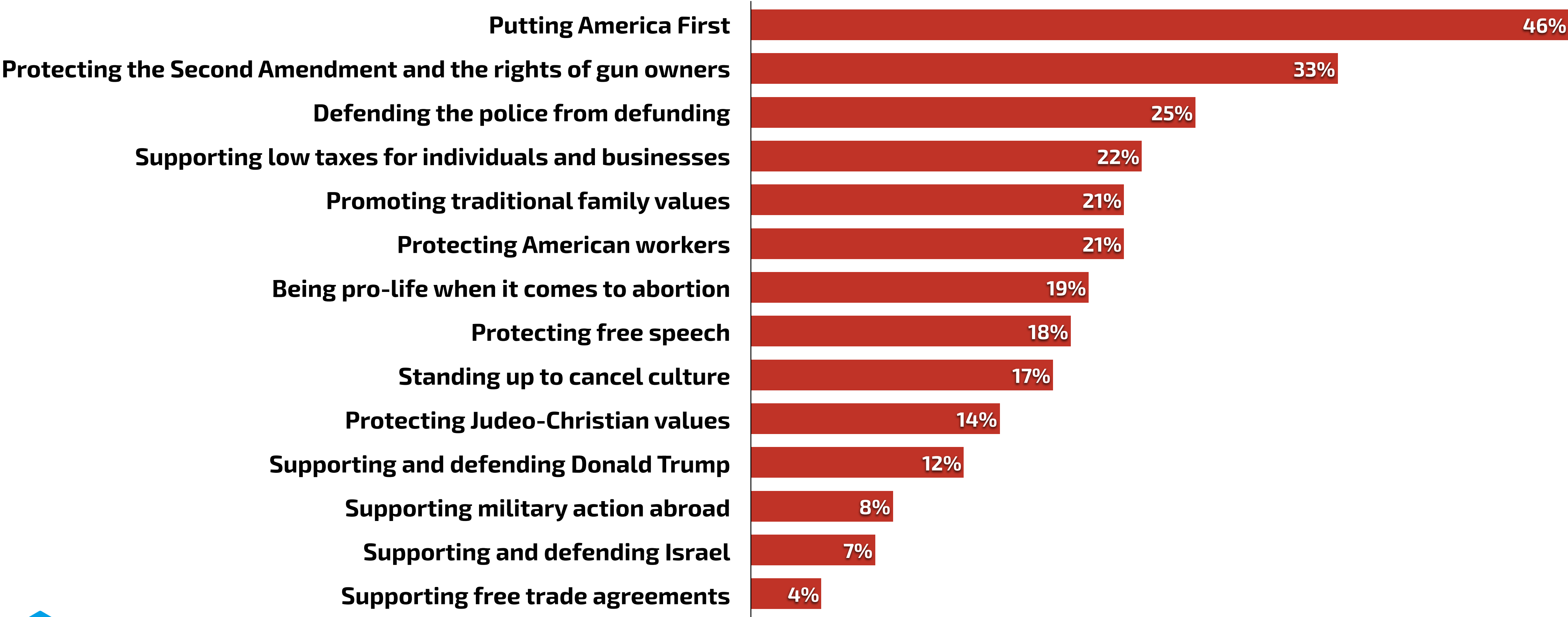

# “Putting America First” Tops Most Important GOP Stances

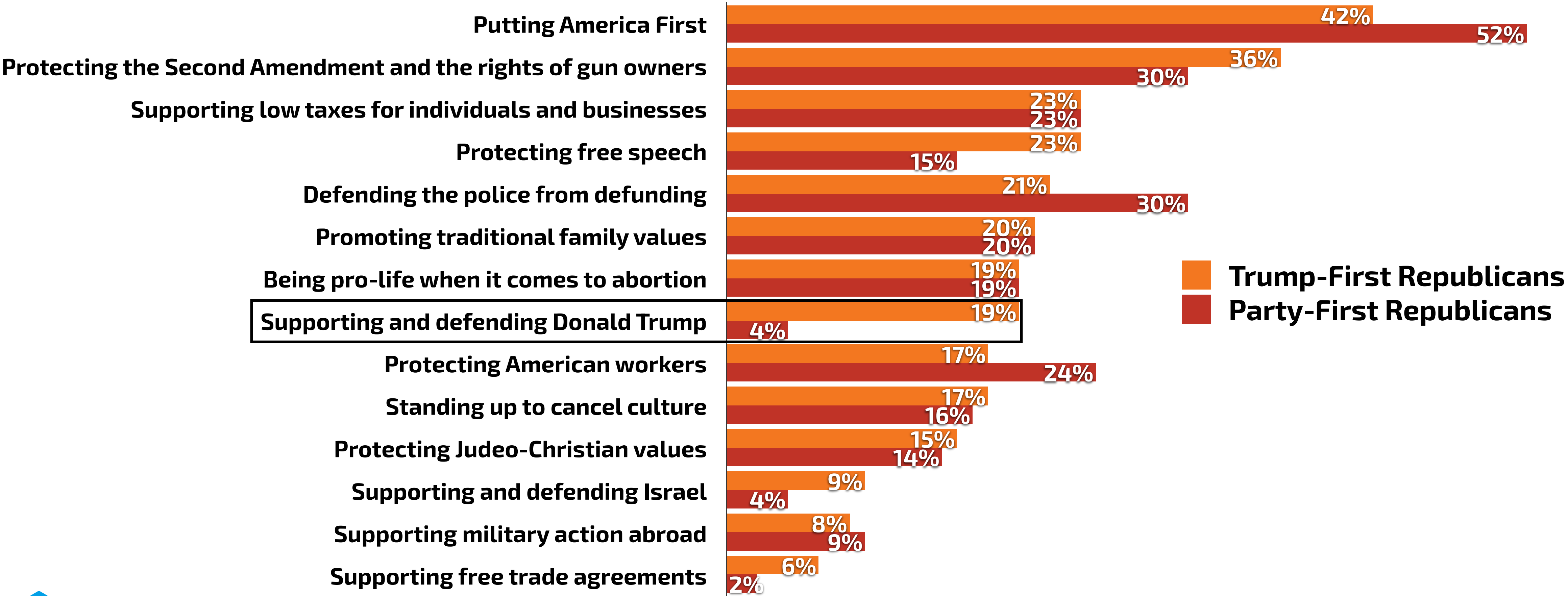
**Q. Which of the following stances would you say are most important to someone calling themselves a Republican? Select up to three. [Asked of Republican+Lean Voters]**

Q. Which of the following stances would you say are most important to someone calling themselves a Republican? Select up to three. [Asked of Republican+Lean Voters]

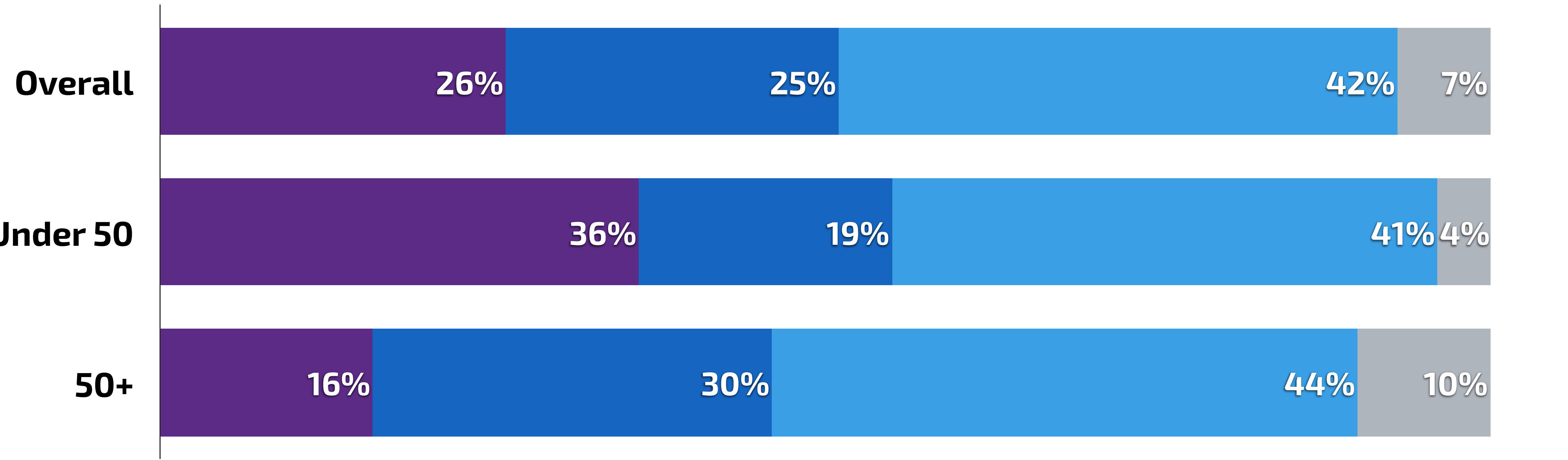

# Younger Democrats Largely Split Between Identifying As Bernie-Style Or Moderate Democrats

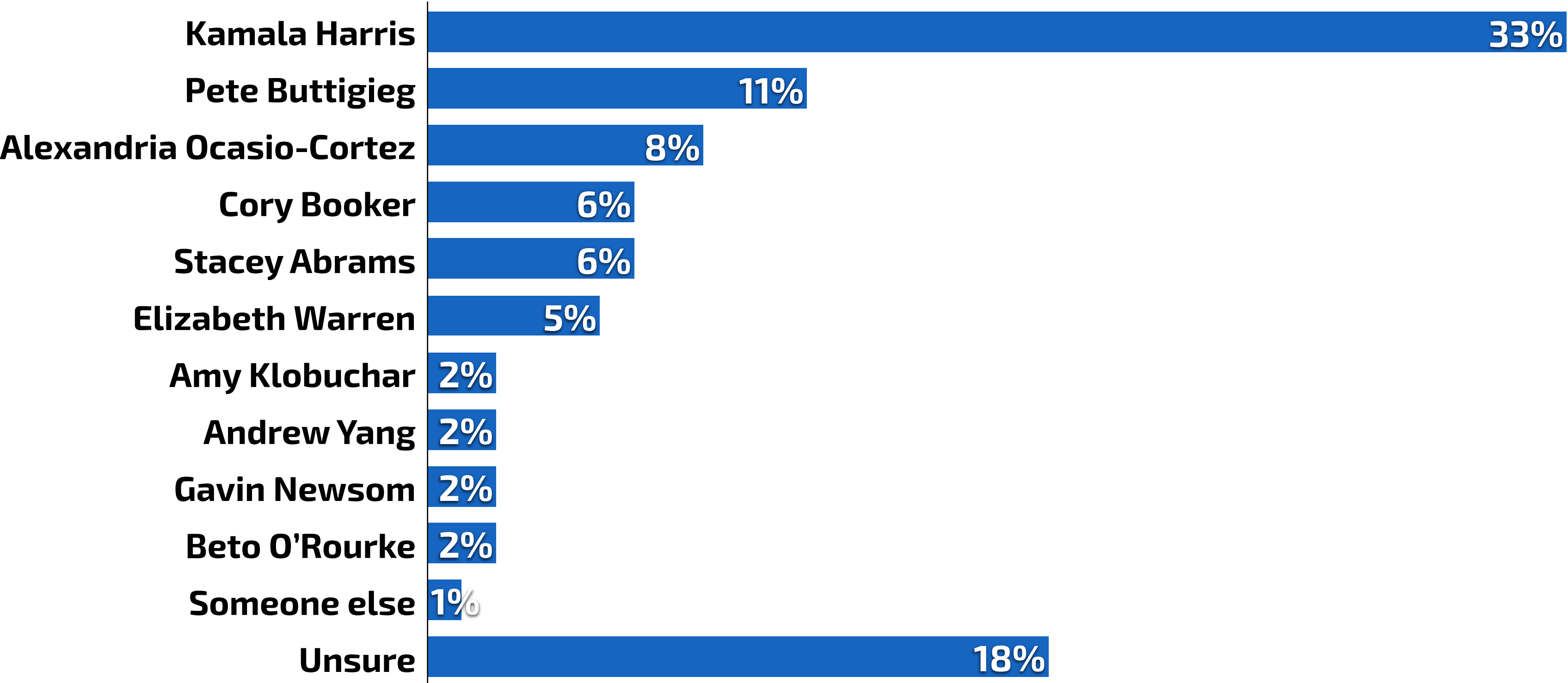
Q. Would you say you consider yourself to be more of a ...? [Asked of Democratic+Lean Voters]

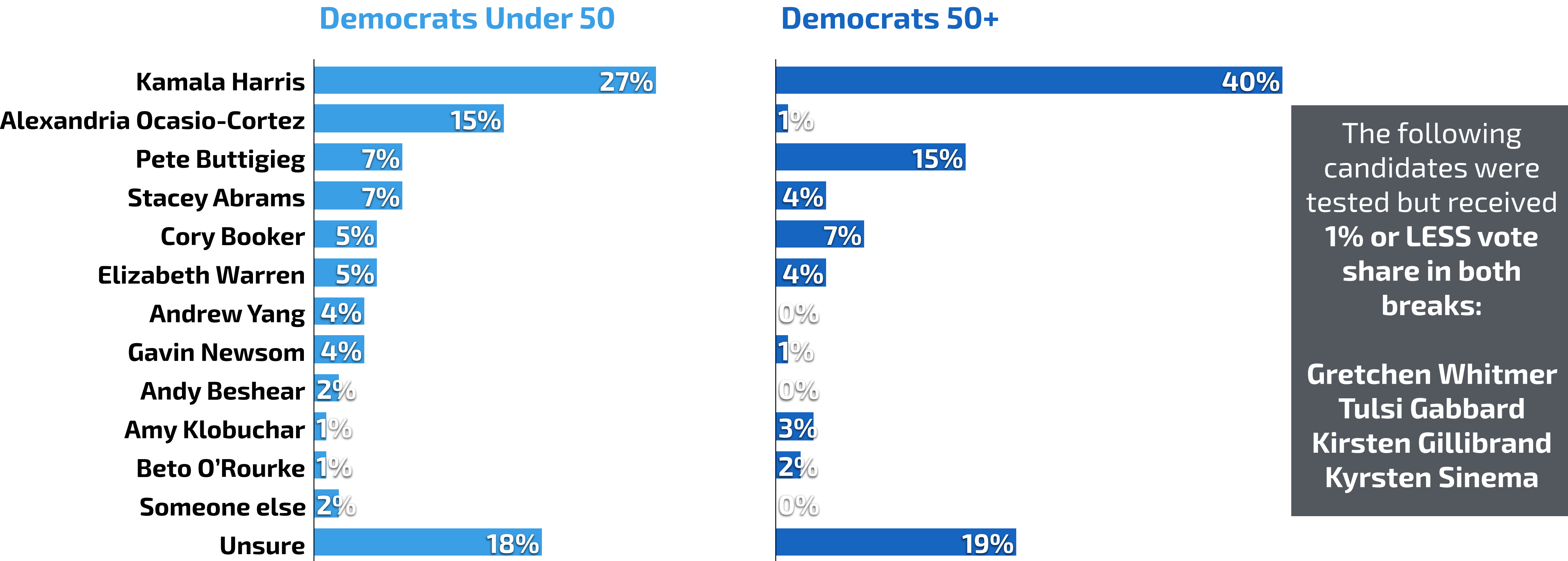

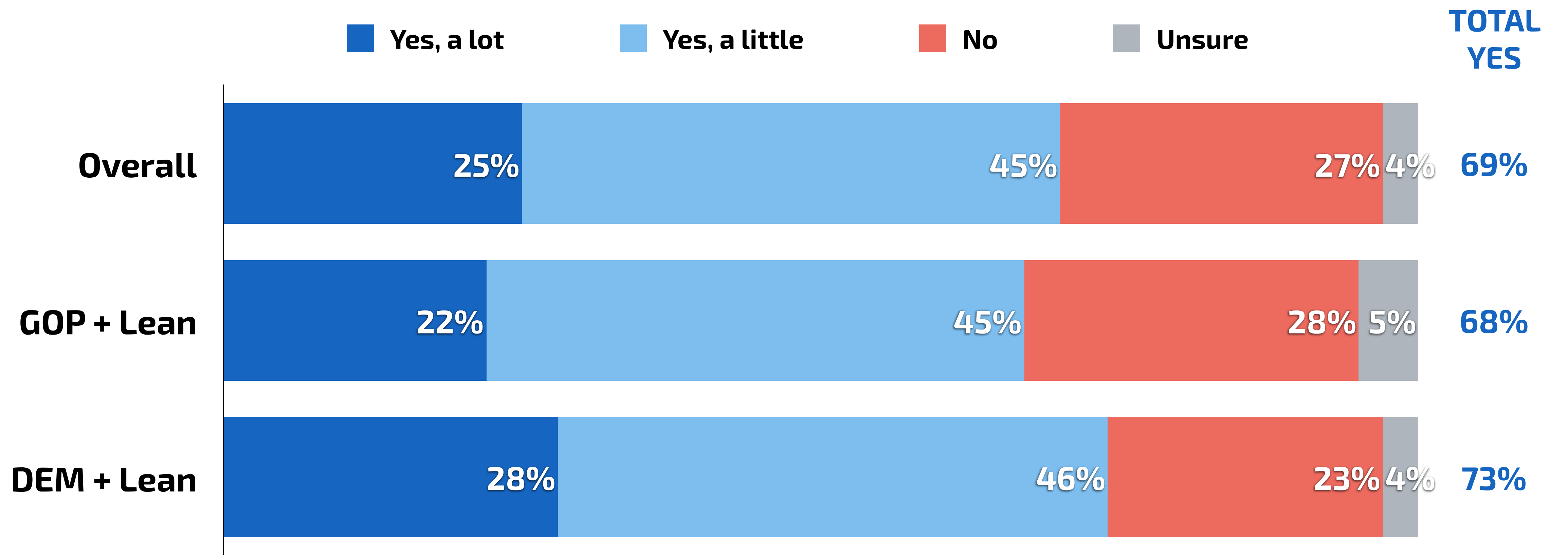

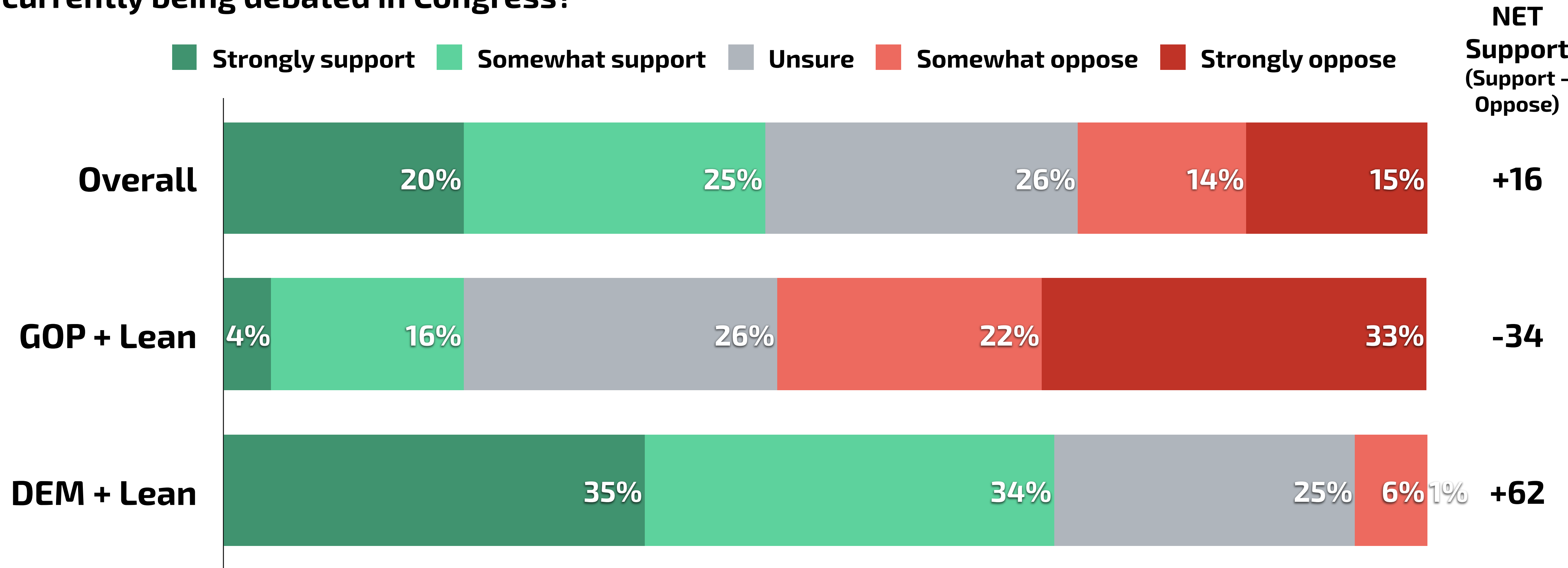

Q. Based on what you have heard, do you support or oppose the \$3.5 trillion budget resolution currently being debated in Congress?

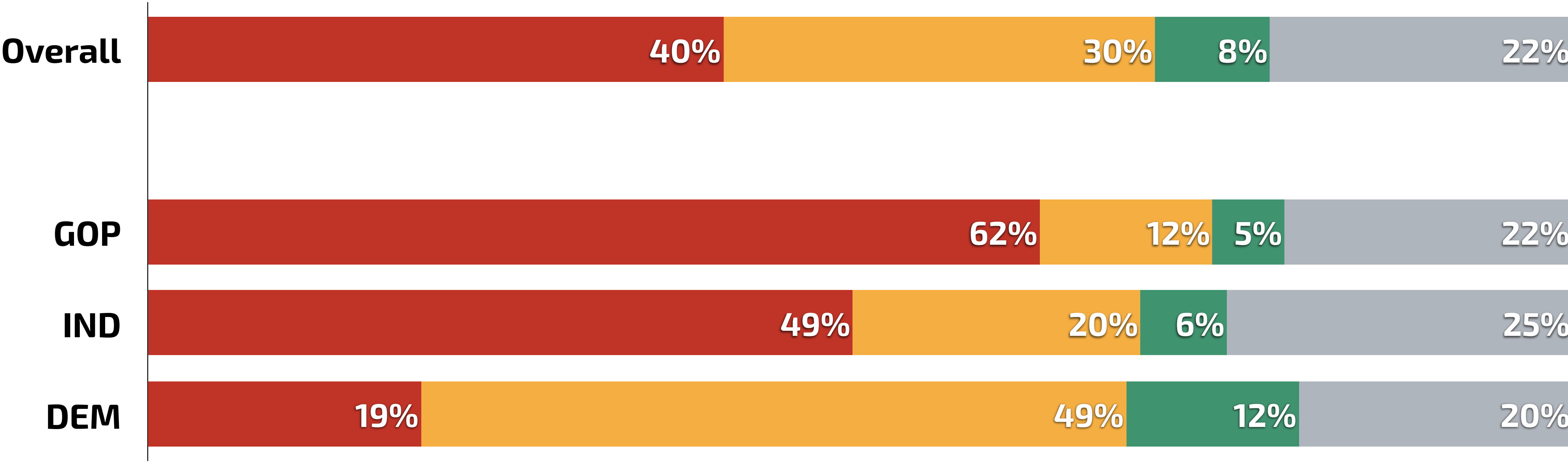




# Half Of Independents Say \$3.5 Trillion Is Too Much Spending

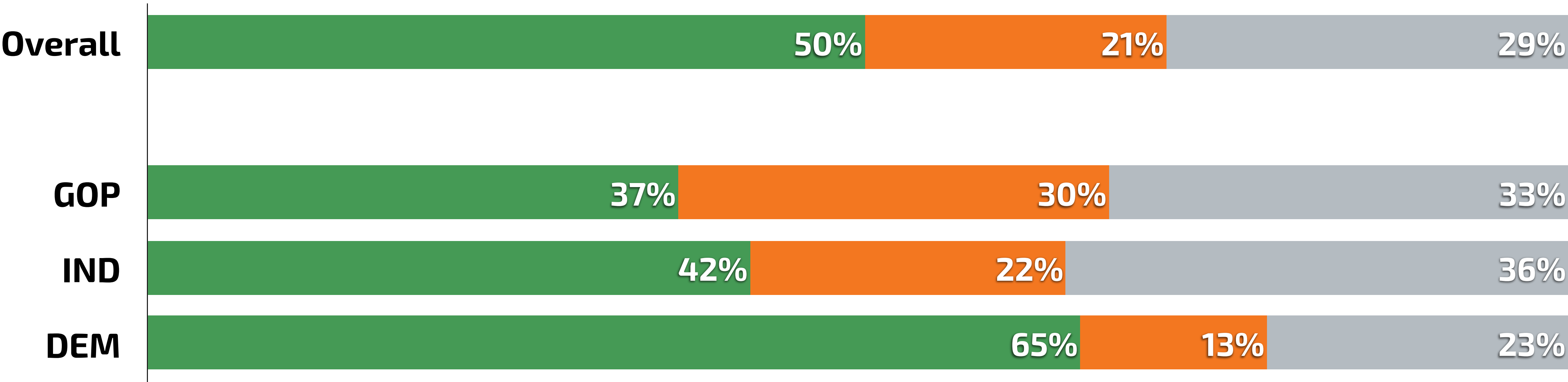
