


2020 Election Update

Verified Voter Omnibus Survey N=1,000 National Registered Voters March 20 - 24, 2020



Key Findings

- Two-thirds (66%) of Democratic and Democratic-leaning likely voters say they would definitely or probably vote for Joe Biden in the Democratic primary, compared to 29% who would support Bernie Sanders. Biden's lead on this question has widened from 16 points in January to 37 points now.
- In a general election match-up, Biden holds a 9-point advantage over Donald Trump among registered voters (50% vs. 41%).
- In match-ups with Amy Klobuchar and Kamala Harris as Biden's potential running mates, Biden-Klobuchar leads by 9 points, but Biden-Harris would see that advantage cut to 5 points (47% vs. 42%).



Methodology

- Using a voter file-matched online panel, we surveyed n=1,000 registered voters across the country from March 20–24.
- We also tracked changes in the attitudes and behaviors of voters since our last Verified Voter Omnibus Survey, which we conducted January 20–23.




The Democratic Primary


