METHODOLOGY

This survey was fielded from August 15–17, 2023 among a sample of N=800 likely 2024 Republican primary voters in New Hampshire. The sample was drawn from the L2 voter file. 400 respondents were contacted via text message and completed the survey online, and 400 were interviewed by live interviewers over the phone, on both landlines and cell phones. The sample was weighted to population benchmarks for likely Republican primary voters in New Hampshire on gender, age, and congressional district. Calculated the way it would be for a random sample and adjusted to incorporate the effect of weighting, the margin of sampling error is ± 4.0 percentage points.

This survey was conducted by Echelon Insights on behalf of the Republican Main Street Partnership.
